<p><b>Key Concepts in this subject for children to learn and remember (knowledge, skills, vocabulary)</b></p> <p>One per box, between 6-12 depending on age and length of unit of work.</p>	<p><b>Worldview</b></p> <p>A person's beliefs that help them understand the world and choose how to live.</p>	<p><b>Hinduism</b></p>	<p><b>Inspire</b></p> <p>Rama and Sita inspire Hindu's to follow their duty. Many Hindu stories are about inspirational characters who follow their duty no matter what.</p>	<p><b>Dharma</b></p> <p>This means duty, like playing an important part. Everyone has a role or duty in life - like playing a role in a team.</p>	<p><b>Diwali</b></p> <p>A Hindu festival of new beginnings and the triumph of good over evil, and light over darkness. Known as the 'festival of lights.'</p>	<p><b>Raksha Bandhan</b></p> <p>A Hindu festival celebrating brothers and sisters (<b>siblings</b>) and the love and duty between them.</p> <p>Siblings have a duty to look after each other.</p>
