<p>Key Concepts in this subject for children to learn and remember (knowledge, skills, vocabulary)</p> <p>One per box, between 6-12 depending on age and length of unit of work.</p>	<p>Abstract art does not try to accurately represent a visual reality but instead uses shapes, colours, forms to express ideas and emotions.</p>	<p>Pablo Picasso was one of the most important artists of the 20th century. His art was often abstract but took reality as a starting point.</p>	<p>Realistic art is also generally used to describe artworks painted in a realistic almost photographic way.</p>	<p>Leonardo da Vinci (Leonardo of Vinci, Italy) was interested in creating realistic sketches and paintings.</p>	<p>Kelvin Okafor is a hyper-realist artist who specialises in pencil portraits. It has been said that, "If Leonardo da Vinci was alive today and he saw what Okafor has achieved with pencil, paper and a bit of charcoal, he would recognise a talent well-worthy of his respect - a brother in art." - Jonathan Jones</p>	<p>Focus: I have the self-control to maintain focus on long term goals above short term instincts. 	<p>Different grades of pencil create different lines, textures and tones.</p>	<p>Tone refers to the lightness or darkness of colour.</p>	<p>There is a difference between a normal pencil grip and an artist pencil grip. Both can be used for drawing. The artist grip allows more contact between the paper and pencil and can be used to create different marks.</p>	<p>Leonardo was also interested in the ideal proportions of the human body, and the information he gathered helped him to make remarkably accurate and realistic depictions of people.</p>	<p>Leonardo da Vinci found that the human face generally has the same proportions.</p>
