

## Wilburton Church of England Primary School: Uniform

Our uniform is designed to be inexpensive and practical. We feel that the uniform is important in giving us a sense of group identity and contributes to the ethos of the school. Our main school uniform colour is bottle green with either grey or white.

Children in Reception are really helped by having practical clothes which are easy to take on and off. Elasticated waistbands are useful for sudden toilet visits, and Velcro fastenings are good too! If your child cannot yet tie laces, please don't give them shoes with laces. Children in Reception can wear PE kits each day, because so much of their learning is active, and both indoors and out. Shoes/trainers should be suitable for running in. All children in school can wear their PE kit all day on days when they have PE or Forest School, or after school sports clubs.

Bags: The school is also able to order book bags, rucksacks and PE bags.

'Modesty shorts'/cycle shorts/leggings can be worn under dresses (but not on their own);

Jewellery and make-up are not allowed. Children with pierced ears may only wear simple studs. Please note that for reasons of safety children MUST remove these for P.E. and swimming, and they must be able to do this themselves. It is not safe to cover them with tape.
