Background:

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

The vision:

ALL pupils leaving primary school are physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

The objective:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long-lasting impact against the vision (above) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

Expected outcomes:

1. All pupils will be engaged in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles;
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement;
3. Staff have increased confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport;
4. A broader experience of a range of sports and activities is offered to all pupils;
5. There is increased participation in competitive sport.

The school has already moved forward significantly in achieving the above since the funding began and the following report details how the money has been spent in 2022-23 in order to continue this good work and achieve even more!
