

## **Pupil Premium Summary for Wilburton CE Primary School 2025-26**

**Purpose:** The pupil premium grant is funding to improve educational outcomes for disadvantaged pupils in state-funded schools in England.

£1515 = the amount of funding for each primary-aged pupil per year who is eligible for free school meals, or have been eligible in the past 6 years.

27 pupils at Wilburton receive pupil premium funding (October 2025).

This is **26%**, which is just above the national average (24.6%)

**10** pupil premium pupils (37%) also have SEN needs with individualised provision maps.

The school's total funding for 2025-26 (financial year) is £40,905

To ensure that pupil premium is focused on effective approaches to raising the educational attainment of disadvantaged pupils, schools must use their pupil premium in line with the 'menu of approaches' set by the Department for Education. This is how the school allocates this funding under these approaches:

## 1. Supporting high quality teaching for all

- Subscribing to the EYFS support package from the Local Authority, for support and training to sustain improvement and with help to establish our pre-school (£500).
- Funding staff training: CPD that helps to achieve school improvement plan aims (£6950)
- Phonics development days and training package (£1200).
- French curriculum subscription (£250)
- Instrument tuition for Year 4 and subsidy for Year 5 and 6 pupil premium pupils (£2519)
- 2 hours per week Inclusion Lead (£5000)
- Attendance and Progress tracking (£500)

## 2. Targeted academic support

• Teaching Assistant hours to provide language intervention, phonics tutoring, reading, writing and maths support and interventions (£24,593)

## 3. Tackling non-academic barriers to academic success

- 1 hour per week of Admin time to support attendance (£758)
- Financial support for children to attend school trips and for resources (£1500)
- Mental Health interventions for pupils (£1000)
